

We met a lot of hospitality and kendo-knowledge, and had a really good time.


Therefore we hope that this is a kind of event that has come to stay. Thanks, Berlin!

It will be distributed all over the world and the purpose is to spread of kendoinformation events


in different countries. There are two important conditions for the future of this paper.

These senseis, together with some British instructors organised the seminar. What had been a totally British seminar, now became an international one.


Eight persons from different Dojo's in Stockholm left Sweden to take part in this event.




