








### Kendo - Scoring



KENDO means the way of the sword, but briefly stated it is Japanese fencing, the ancient practice of swordmanship of the Japanese Samurai.

A carefully shaped cylinder of four pieces of bamboo is substituted for the real sword, this is called a **Shinai**.

The target areas of the body are protected by a padded mask with a metal grill to protect the face (Men), a heavy breastplate of bamboo splints and rawhide to protect the trunk of the body (Do), and padded gauntlets for the hands and wrists (Kote), as well as a padded thigh protector (Tare).

This equipment permits realistic combat fencing matches that follow the rules and principles of traditional Japanese swordmanship.

The cuts reconised by the Judges in Tournaments are:

Figure 1 — Men, a cut to the centre peak of the mask (A), or to either temple as in (B) or (C).

Figure 2 – Kote, a cut to the right wrist when the hands are at waist level, to either wrist when the hands are overhead.

Figure 3 - Do, a cut to either side of the trunk of the body.

Figure 4 — Tsuki, a thrust with the tip of the shinai to the throat (A), or to the Mune (B), which is the top part of the Do, when your opponent is fighting in Jodan Waza (sword held above the head).

These are the only valid points. A match is won either when one contestant scores two points, or if only one point has been scored at the end of match time, the contestant who scored that point, wins the combat.

If extensions are permitted, in the event that no point has been scored or one point each has been scored during the regular match time, the first point scored in the over-time extension wins.

If no extensions are permitted, the match is a draw.
